

## NARROW BAND FREQUENCIES FOR SAR

1. They will be issued under the state's Master License program much like OSCCR and 155.160 MHz are now; through application from the local DEM or SO offices.
2. The state license is for mobile or portable use only. No base units or repeaters.
3. The license is for actual SAR missions only. Cannot be used for training.
4. These frequencies must be used on a non-interference basis. We would be secondary to their use.
5. Narrow band operation is scheduled to go into effect in 2013.
6. Finalization for the state program is expected around the first of the year.
7. These frequencies are found in title 47-telecommunication, Chapter 1 FCC, Part 90 – Private Land Mobile Radio services, Subpart B – Public Safety Radio Pool.
